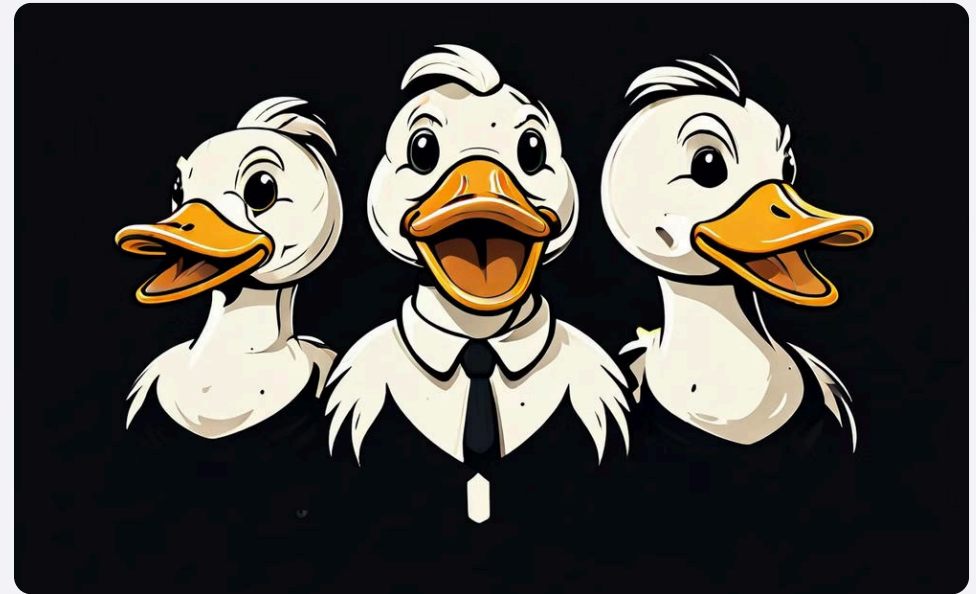
The Magic Finger
